Introduction and Announcements:

Chair Grosch convened the meeting at 11:00 a.m. A roll call was taken and a quorum of six Board Members were present to begin the meeting. Chair Grosch officially welcomed Greg Kazmer as the Alternate for County of San Diego Dist. 2 Supervisor, Joel Anderson.

1. Approval of Resolution 22-9 Authorizing Remote Teleconference Meetings per AB 361

<u>Executive Directors Report</u> — Director Anderson shared a photo of the new Coastal Ranger Station Monument sign, provided through an Edison International grant. The Ranger Station also has a new kiosk provided by a local Eagle Scout, filled with information about the W-19 Restoration Project and current events. Director Anderson summarized the progress of the Get-To-71 Miles joint Fundraising campaign, including the fact that we're at 67% of goal. The plan is to raise 90% of the funding goal while in the "quiet phase" and launch a public phase to raise the final 10%. Director Anderson also reported that JPA staff received several quality proposals from consultant teams who responded to the JPA's trail design RFP solicitation. A selection committee will review the proposals.

2. Approval of SDG&E Easement Amendment on JPA Property at Sycamore Westridge

Director Anderson explained the proposed amendment for the purpose of replacing one wooden utility pole with a steel pole. The amendment to the existing easement is limited to the area needed for the new pole to keep habitat impacts to a minimum on the preserve. Motion to approve the SDG&E Easement Amendment on JPA Property at Sycamore Westridge was made by Board Member LaCava and seconded by Board Member Kazmer.

3. JPA ad-hoc Budget Committee Report – Board Member Worden stated that the ad-hoc committee consisting of Boardmembers Worden, Fuller, and Inscoe met on 9/8/2022 and reviewed the JPA's endowment accounts held at three foundations. The committee concluded that although the funds took a hit over the last several months of 2022 due to the recent economic downturn, the endowment funds are invested for the long-term and overall remain in good condition. The committee also discussed the JPA's investment policy and oversite guidelines, which require financial oversight of JPA investments. The committee recommended several future actions including: 1) establishing an oversite committee with assistance from a financial expert from one of the JPA's member agencies to review endowment performance and other financial matters, 2) address the JPA's operations endowment that remains only partially funded, and 3) review the record of each foundation's contributions to SDRP projects to increase participation and contributions. Board Member Worden stated that no specific actions items are recommended at this time but that the issues be addressed at future JPA meeting. Board Member Inscoe offered to reach out to her contacts at the San Diego Foundation.

4. Citizens Advisory Committee Request to JPA Board regarding Surf Cup Sports

Request from the CAC was presented to the JPA Board to take action to help resolve the long-standing delays of the required Coast to Crest Trail and habitat restoration on Surf Cup Sports leasehold (property owned by the City), as well as illegal grading and parking activities observed by the public on adjacent property that Surf Cup Sports recently purchased. Specific recommendations were presented to the JPA Board by the CAC, along with photos and documented maps of the affected wetlands.

Following discussion by the Boardmembers, a motion was made in three parts:

- 1) Forward entire JPA agenda report to Councilmember LaCava's office with JPA Board recommendation that the City of San Diego resolve the issue by setting a timeline for when the trail and habitat restoration must be completed by Surf Cup Sports.
- 2) Notify the City of San Diego that the JPA Board takes seriously the allegation of violations conducted by Surf Cup Sports on their adjacent property (3975 Via de la Valle, aka former Milan property) and ask the City to resolve this issue.
- 3) Direct JPA staff to notify the resource agencies, Army Corp of Engineers, U.S. Fish and Wildlife, and the Regional Water Quality Control Board, about the grading and filling of wetlands on the former Milan property.

Motion to approve was made by Board Member Worden and seconded by Board Member Kazmer.

- a. Osuna Segment of CTC Trail Project is in the permit process at the City of San Diego. Director Anderson stated that the San Dieguito Planning Group at their September meeting approved sending a letter to the County Parks staff requesting that the County of San Diego elevate the San Dieguito Road Pathway project as a priority capital project. The Pathway will connect directly to the Osuna segment of the CTC Trail. They will be sending a letter to the County Parks staff.

7. Jurisdictional Status Reports -

Dwight Worden reported that Southern California Edison contractors are scheduled to dredge the San Dieguito River mouth in November, as part of their permit obligation to keep the river mouth open to tidal flow. The work was rescheduled after being delayed earlier this year due to tar balls from the oil spill in Huntington Beach.

Chair Dave Grosh expressed his gratitude of Director Shawna's contributions.

Board Member LaCava introduced his staff person Carrie Shah, who is replacing Ricky Flahive's position.
