Why Is This Trail Called The Dust Devil Nature Trail?

“Dust Devils” are dedicated volunteers who work side-by-side with the Park Rangers on important projects such as building and maintaining trails, and restoring and managing habitat.

The Dust Devil volunteer group was started in the early 1990s by a few concerned individuals, led by River Park supporter Max Kiltz, who were frustrated with the condition of the trails around Lake Hodges and San Pasqual Valley.

In those days, the San Dieguito River Park did not have Park Rangers available to build or maintain trails, so these devoted volunteers did the work themselves.

As the San Dieguito River Park grew, so did the contributions of these skilled Dust Devil volunteers. In the past, many Park projects would not be completed without their insight and assistance. This trail was built by Dust Devils and Park Rangers.
